Competitors:

Only registered members of the Association of Irish Riding Clubs at the close of entries are eligible to enter this event.

Competitors may only compete at their cross-country grade at the time of entering, irrespective of any subsequent grade changes.

It is the competitors' responsibility to be fully conversant with the rules for this competition.

Horses:

Horses must be entered under their registered name as described on their passport, at this event. They may only start twice on the day of this event. Consult rule 6 in the rules and regulations document (D04/12) for eligibility criteria.

If your horse is not registered with the Association, you will not be able to enter online. For information on registering a horse, <u>click here</u>. Please ensure to register your horse in time before entering this event.

You can check to see if your horse is already registered by logging into your <u>membership online</u> account or alternatively by searching for it, using its registered name, <u>here</u>.

Postal Entries:

Postal entries are accepted through your club secretary on the official entry form to arrive no later than Wednesday 28th March.

To enter this event, please provide your club secretary with your name, your membership number, your horses registered name and the competitions you are entering (i.e. individual championship and/or pairs).

Incomplete or late postal entries will be not be processed and will be returned to your club secretary.

Online Entries:

Online entries are accepted through the membership online service from Thursday 29th March until 15:00 on Thursday 5th April. Never used this service before? read this.

Entry Fees & Information:

Hors concours and novice horse entries are not accepted at this event.

 on your arm. Timing devices are not permitted under the rules for Advanced Primary and
 Intermediate riders.
- Competitors will have to provide their own number bib for this event. A limited supply will be available for sale, priced at €15, on the day but to guarantee supply it is best advised to purchase a bib before the event. Contact National Office on 045 854 555 to order a bib.
- There will be no farrier service available at this event.
